Alumni Highlight

Paula Pérez is the leader of **Jovemcafé**, a group of 25 women coffee entrepreneurs from Guatemala. As part of the Incubator, Paula and the members of her group created a collective egg-laying hen business to increase income between coffee harvest seasons.

Thanks to their engagement with TCC, Jovemcafé's members report having increased confidence, connections, and capacity to continue turning their future project ideas into realities.

Now, as part of the Alumni Network, Paula would like to continue engaging more young people in her community and building their confidence as leaders. Their next project is a small livestock initiative through which young adults in their community can generate income during coffee's off season.



"Through the experiences that I've had as part of the incubator, I have gained a lot of confidence. I trust myself that I can achieve what I want and work alongside my community despite challenges. After this project's success, I know I can manage an initiative with a successful business model like this on my own, and I trust that we will be able to carry out many more projects in the future."
